Goldendale, Wash,-The first home grown strawberries were put on the market here Saturday. County Commissioner C. O. Barnes, who is the largest local grower, says the crop is 0 not seriously damaged by the cold 0 weather in May. The first picking 0 sold for \$3 a crate, but growers are booking orders for berries for canning purposes at \$2.
