Steady Tone is Shown in the Sheep and Land Trade—Hogs Advanced a Nickel to a Dime Yesterday—California Cattle Coming.

(From Monday's Journal.) Hogs advanced a nickel to a dime at North Portland this morning, selling to \$6.95 as compared with recent tops at \$6.90.

There was a run of 473 cattle in the local yards over Sunday, with most of the arrivals from eastern Oregon. One lot of Idaho stuff and a shipment from Washington came forward.

At South Omaha there was a slow and weak tone in the cattle trade, with steers at \$5.80 and \$6.10, and cows at \$5.45 and \$5.60.

At Chicago the cattle trade was weaker with values generally 10c lower.
