## HOW JESS HALL WAS CAPTURED BY WEST

### GOVERNOR CAUGHT BIG FELLOW IN TIMBER

"I Am The Man You Lied To," Said  
Executive When Asked if He Were  
the Sheriff—Hall Has 15 Years  
Yet to Serve.

Salem, Ore., June 24.—The following is the story of the capture of the paroled convict Jesse Hall as given by Governor West who had the posse that captured the fellow:

"After leaving the auto in the rough country between Corvallis and Peak, we organized a posse and entered the timber region at noon. At dusk the party I was with got refreshments at a Swiss farm house, and after a few minutes later we found a farmer who had seen smoke from a small campfire in the timber not far away. After walking over to Blodgett, two miles away, and phoning to the boys at Peak, we entered the timber. After some search we came into the opening and discovered smoke against a bank of green timber.

"We began circling the campfire, creeping as silently as possible upon

a man evidently sleeping. I went directly across the opening toward him until within 75 or 80 yards from the fire and then crept around to get behind him so he could not break away into timber again. When within 40 yards of Hall I stepped on a twig, which popped and aroused him. When his massive form came up to a sitting posture, I covered him with a gun and he immediately surrendered. The boys all came up, we disarmed him and fed him and went back to the automobile.

"The Man You Lied to,"  
"When Hall saw me he said, 'Are you the sheriff?'"  
"No," I replied, "I am the man you lied to."

"Oh," whined Hall and began to offer some kind of apologies. He admitted he had made a fool of himself and was sorry. He has 15 years to serve. His privileges will be taken away and he will be given inside work.

"I am more than ever in favor of the new system. Under the old system we lost from 25 to 28 each year, but under the present system we have lost but two and recaptured one of these."

That sentiment here is predominantly in favor of the West system and no fear is being felt by farmers is proven by the fact that a petition is now being prepared by the people of Sublimity for the governor to return the convicts to the road work, which was stopped because of the complaint of one man that he feared the prisoners working unguarded.

### Hell White Man's Hope.

While in prison before the attempted escape, Jess Hall boasted of his prowess as a prize fighter and declared openly that he was the white man's only hope. As he was being brought back into the prison gates this morning, faded and with ropes around him to prevent his having to be shot if he tried to break away, fellow prisoners gathered about were heard to remark:

"It's all off now with the white race."
