DAY PROJECT FEASIBLE BUT INDEFINITELY POSTPONED

Congressman Lafferty is Assured that Oregon Will Receive Her Share From Reclamation Fund.

Hermiston, Ore., June 30.—Word has been received from Congressman A. W. Lafferty that he has had a conference with Director F. H. Newell of the reclamation service in regard to the proposed West Side extension of the Umatilla Irrigation project.

The result of this conference was given in a press dispatch from Washington a few days ago.

State Will Get Money.

On account of the Secretary of the Interior Fisher being practically unfamiliar with the situation of the Reclamation Service, any recommendation that is made by Director Newell will be accepted without question, so the above statements made by Mr. Newell give assurance to the people of the state of Oregon that they will receive their share of the monies due her from the reclamation fund.

FOUR TEAM LEAGUE MAY BE FORMED

PROSPECTIVE PLANS FOR FORMATION ARE OUTLINED

Pendleton, Milton-Freewater, Walla Walla and Athena are Towns Included for Representation in Blue Mountain.

With only one more game to play before the season of the Blue Mountain league closes as arranged on the schedule, local fans and members of the Walla Walla baseball club are advocating a four-team league of the same order to continue through the summer, thus giving summer baseball for the fans of the city, when there is little else doing in any of the towns, says the Walla Walla Union.

Echo has already dropped out and Weston is about to, leaving Pendleton, Milton-Freewater, Athena and Walla Walla with well organized teams which may play throughout the summer months. Athena could join with Weston to some extent and strengthen that team, although the article of ball put up has been good, while Milton-Freewater has already demonstrated ability to support a team. Pendleton is doing well and the Bears are always there.

Expenses would be less and the attendance should not be decreased much, as during the latter part of July and all of August a good baseball game would revive the monotony of the many a workman's routine.

Aside from a few petty troubles, the Blue Mountain league has been a big success this year. The managers in each town have had an uphill

fight, for baseball in every one of the towns had been run into the ground in previous years with careless management and lack of interest.

Baseball has climbed many rounds higher this spring in Walla Walla, the people beginning to realize that while the Blue Mountain league may be brushy to some extent, it has put up several games that would rank with any major league ball, and that Walla Walla has a team in the field this year that is as good as any that ever represented the city.

The Northwest league will never come to Walla Walla, but she may go after it, and this can only be done by gradual steps. The fans must support the game when they are playing as good ball as now and when baseball men see that the game will pay, it will only be a matter of a suitable leader to land the Garden City in the bigger league.

The Walla Walla baseball club will probably hold a meeting in the next day or two and make some overture to the other towns of the league and ascertain whether summer baseball is desired and if so, no time will be lost in organizing.
