

gerous one and a number of serious accidents have already occurred at that point. The crossing is just west of a cut and the track curves just beyond the cut. Consequently westbound trains are invisible to parties going upon the crossing from the west. It has occurred in the past that the noise made by wagons has prevented drivers from hearing the onrushing trains.

When the signal bell is installed it will give long notice of the approach of trains and in the view of men like Major Swartzlander who have been working upon the subject it will be a very timely improvement,


