**CATTLE RECEIPTS ARE STILL UNUSUALLY HEAVY**

Heavy Selling of Commission Merchants, Forces Slump in Chicago Wheat Market—Price Drops Over Two Cents.

**LEWISTON NORMAL IN THE LEAD**

Lewiston, Idaho.—The coming year of the Lewiston State Normal school promises to be the best in the history of that state institution, according to Dean Hallowell, who is quoted in a Spokane paper. The student enrollment in 1910-11 was 332, and in 1911-12 it is expected that it will be at least 400. Several new instructors have been added to the faculty, which now numbers twenty-eight. Of the seven normals in the Pacific Northwest, Lewiston leads, from the point of view of equipment, efficiency of faculty, courses offered, and student enrollment. It is expected that the senior class which will graduate in June 1912 will number at least fifty. No normal school in the west has grown so rapidly as the one at Lewiston.
