DISCOVERS WAY TO STOP ROOSTERS CROWING

Chicago Chief of Police Is Man to Whom Suffering Public Is Indebted.

Chicago .--- Chief McWeeny's method of silencing obnoxious roosters that wake up the neighbors was made known In a letter to Lieutenant Howard of the Lake street station he told the lieutenant how to stop the prowing and incidentally told him to employ the method in the case of two roosters at 223 South Lincoln street. 
