LAMB'S CORD MAY REVIVE GIRL'S LEG

Tendon of Live Sheep is Sewed on Limp Limb.

Portland, Ore.—By taking the tendon, Achilles, from the leg of a lamb and sewing it into the bone of the left leg of 11-year-old Melissa Oades, an operation performed Wednesday by Doctors Rich and Marsh, at the Good Samaritan Hospital, the little girl, who has been paralyzed in both lower

limbs for the last two years, is expected to recover the use of her limbs.

For six weeks a plaster cast will be kept in place and the girl will be kept abed. After that she will be allowed to walk with the cast on her leg until the sewed-in tendon is tied up with grown tissue and has become a part of her anatomy.

Putting the girl and the lamb under ether on an operating table in the surgery department of the hospital, Dr. Rich removed the tendon from the leg of the lamb and sewed it securely upon the top layer of bone in the girl's leg, putting the limb in a cast after the operation. The wound made in the lamb's leg after the operation was also attended to and the animal, little the worse for the operation, was soon frisking about the grounds of the hospital.

The girl rallied well from the shock of the operation, which is thought to have been successful.

The operation is believed to be the first of its kind in Portland and not many cases have been found in the United States. The usual tendons used in replacing human tendons are those from dogs, but the parents, of the girl, who lives at 616 East Twenty-first street, were opposed to the use of a dog's muscle and a lamb was substituted.

POWER COMPANY TO SPEND MILLIONS

Will Dam Columbia River and Generate One Million Horse Power at Expense of \$10,000,000.

Spokane, Wash.—Official announcement will be made before the end of September by the Pacific Power & Light company of its plans to develop 1,000,000 horsepower by hydroelectric installation in the Columbia river at Priest Rapids, Wash., south-west of Priest Rapids, Wash., at a cost of \$10,000,000 to \$15,000,000. It is estimated that eight years will be required to complete the work.

The project includes the construction of an enormous dam across the river at the foot of the rapids, the face of the wall to be 75 feet in height or equal to the drop of the stream in a distance of nine miles; the building of the high line canal of the Hanford irrigation plant, and the stringing of a network of transmission lines to supply power and light to a large portion of eastern Washington.

A wing dam, diverting part of the current of the Columbia river, from the main channel into a power canal, now is furnishing power for the company's electric plant at Priest Rapids, and the use of this method of development will be continued until the large dam is in position and ready to take the load.

The bill passed by Congress recently, giving the Pacific company authority to dam the Columbia river, also provides for locks, whereby navigation will be aided by the completion of the big wall.

Until the company determines its plans and establishes its rights at Priest Rapids, the construction of the Chicago, Milwaukee & Puget Sound railroad from Beverly on the main line, 60 miles up the river. The railroad company has completed four surveys around the face of a 400-foot rock wall and the line will now follow a 75-foot grade to keep above the level of the dam. This involves one of the most expensive pieces of railway construction work in the western country, as it means a cut of nine miles in solid rock.

Spokane, Wash.—Paul Pattison of Colfax, prosecuting attorney of Whitman county, Wash., whose wife is recovering in a Spokane hospital from an injury sustained while playing basketball in the championship series, is authority for the statement that with a single exception every member of the Colfax team, of which he was manager, has undergone an operation, also that all the players on the Cheney normal team has been under the surgeon's knife. Dr. A. E. Shult, who attended Mrs. Pattison, declares that basketball is injurious and should not be engaged in by girls or women, adding: "The nature of women should keep them from this dangerous sport." Mrs. Pattison, formerly Miss Maud Smith, was a member of the Colfax team when it won the championship of the inland empire and had been under two operations within the last six months.

MAMMOTH SEIN WILL CLEAR LAKE OF CARP

Spokane, Wash.—Fishing with a sein 5,400 feet in length and 30 feet in width, operated by a powerful windlass, is the work in which employees of Bartholomew Brothers of St. Louis, Mo., will engage the middle of this month, in an effort to clear the lakes in Spokane county of carp. The fish will be sent to St. Louis, Kansas City, Chicago and other eastern points in refrigeration cars. It is estimated that the total shipments will amount to more than 50 cars. Trout, bass and other game fish caught in the draws will be put back into the water, according to an agreement with the firm and J. A. Uhlig, fish and game warden of the county. The seine fishermen will be accompanied by a state official, who will see that the game fish are protected. Warden Uhlig says that carp weighing up to 30 pounds have been caught on vegetable and fish bait in the vicinity of Spokane this summer. It is estimated that the carp have destroyed millions of trout eggs during the last few years.
