

STILL THE PRICE OF HOGS ADVANCE

PORTLAND RUN TOO SMALL TO TEST MARKET

Quarter Drop in Sheep Market—Cattle steady With Quotations Unchanged—Reaction in Wheat—Half Cent Decline in Price.

(From Tuesday's Journal.) Hogs sold today on the basis of \$8.15 in the stockyards this morning.

Efforts to put the local price of hogs to the basis that it is costing Pacific Northwest packers to bring their supplies from the east, are not altogether successful.

Elsewhere there was a further improvement in the hog market and prices are doing better.

The run of swine here is almost too small to test quotations and until a suitable run of local stock puts in appearance it will be hard to tell just where the basis price stands.

At Chicago today there was a strong tone for swine with the run totaling 14,000 or 2000 greater than the same date a year ago.

At Chicago today sheep and lamb trade was steady to strong today with lambs \$6.25 to \$6.75, yearlings \$19.45 to \$20.00, wethers \$3.20 to \$3.40 and ewes \$2.75 to \$3.25.

Total offerings for the day were 444 head together with 42 calves as compared with 620 cattle and 21 calves last Tuesday.
