In general the swine trade shows no change in character. Arrivals available for the market were but 57 head, these coming in with a mixed load of cattle from Junction City.

MRS. WEBB PLEADS FOR HER HUSBAND. Salem, Ore.—Accompanied by her young daughter, Mrs. Webb, wife of the condemned man now under sentence of death at the state penitentiary, called upon Governor West and pleaded for a continuation of sentence.

The governor listened to all the woman had to say. He did not give an answer, but told her that her prayer would be given every consideration and he would tell her later his decision.

"I will do what I deem is right," he told her. Many petitions in Webb's behalf have been received by Governor West. A few days ago he stated that he would not interfere in the law's course.

Previous to Mrs. Webb going to the state house she was allowed a visit to the prison, where she met with her husband for a brief while.
