Support of Packers Gives Swine Situation Better Outlook - Receipts Decidedly Light-Sheep Market Over Run and Prices Low.

(From Monday's Journal.) There was a big offering of cattle in the North Portland yards today, and the tone of the trade was somewhat weaker than last week, with

the price lower. Contrary to expectations, Montana cattle are again offering in this market. Two loads from Red Rock came forward this morning. The high price of cattle at South Omaha and Chicago is expected to shut the Pacific coast off from that territory un-


