> AMERICA USES MANY PAIRS WOODEN SHOES.

Washington.-Wooden shoes usually associated only with variety shows and pictures of street scenes in Holland, are, in fact, worn by thousands by Vice Counsel De Young, consisted of 600 cases containing several thous and pairs of the lumber footwear, similar shipment was made a few months ago.

Also the report reveals the sections of the United States addicted to tibe habit as follows:

"It is stated that the United States is the best foreign customer of the Netherlands for this article of manufacture, many hundreds of pairs of wooden shoes being worn in Michigan. claimed that there are more wooden shoes in Chicago, Grand Rapids, or Holland, Mich., than in the city of Paterson, N. J., Amsterdam. Louis, Mo. Lancaster county, Nebr., Marion county, Ia., and numerous otner smaller settlements import large quantities of this practical article of dress every year,

"The wooden shoe industry in th Netherlands is generally decentralized, logs being bewn out to the measure of the customer's foot in the village shop. The local price depends largely upon the amount of lumber used and the market price of the raw material. There are, however, a few large factories using modern woodworking machinery and exporting the most of their product. The principal countries to which they export, in order of their importance, are the United States and Canada, West Indies, Germany and South Africa.

MONUMENT TO COLUMBUS ERECTED IN WASHINGTON.

Washington .- A memorial to the memory of Christopher Columbus. widely known as a hold and inquisitive sailor, will be onlyue in Washington from the fact that the statue and acompanying emblematic embellishments will be of chaste white

All the other heroes, whether afoot er on horse back, that adorn most of the open spaces in Washington are celebrated with statues of bronze

or other metal. In the case of the great discoverer, the marble work will include the herole statue of Columbus, two figures of ancient and modern American inhabitants, the shaft which forms the background of the statue, the globe and two eagles which surmount the shaft, the caravel on which the statue stands and its allegorical figurehead, the two lions which decorate the ends of the semi-carcular fountain which provides a setting for the statue, and the superstructure of the fountain basin.

The memorial will adorn the plaza in front of the union station, at the head of a short vista looking from the Capitol. It was designed by Lorado Taft, of Ohlo, a cousin of President He won in a competition in which American and European sculptors participated. The cost of the memorial will be \$70,000.


