It is more difficult to impose upon a city when it has the commission form of government. By the nature of things a commission of three men paid to manage the affairs of a city. may get down to business more thoroughly than will an unpaid city council. If they don't do so it is easy to check up matters and see who is at fault. Under the council system it is often hard to tell who is to blame when affairs are neglected. There are too many officials and responsibility is not closely fixed as it is fixed under the commission plan.

Some successful farmers have used as strong as one "jockey." At times they form com- pound vitrol to two and one-half gallons of water, soaking not more than ten minutes, without serious injury to the wheat. Too strong solution or too long soaking will kill the wheat.

Formalin should be used one pound to forty-five gallons water, the wheat legislative rather than an executive thorounghly wetled by dipping or body and it does not handle adminis- sprinkling, then covered with wet sacks for two hours, then either seeded at once or allowed to dry thor-

> Unbroken smut balls must be removed from seed wheat, as no method of treatment destroys the germs in these bails, and if later broken in the seed wheat they infect the grain.




