Newsy Notes of Pendleton

Church of the Redeemer. Tomorrow being Saint Luke's day, there will be divine services at the Church of the Redeemer at 10 o'clock a. m.

Few Complaints Are Heard. The county board of equalization which is now in session has received but few complaints regarding taxes assessed against property and this fact indicates that the Umatilla county taxpayers are a satisfied lot.

East End Property Sold. Nora Ford has sold to Sam Sample for \$6000, twelve acres several miles east of Freewater and Gustavus Sprague has sold to Kyle McDaniel, 160 acres five miles west of Freewater for \$3500. The deeds for the transactions were received today.

Calgary Booster Here. Jonathan Johnson, general land agent for the C. P. R. railway, is in the city today on his way from Calgary to Chicago. He brings the news that all former Umatilla county farmers who have settled in the Alberta country have harvested bumper crops this year.

Round-Up Pictures in Magazine. The last issue of Leslie's Weekly contains a double page of pictures taken at the recent Round-Up by Marcel, which present Pendleton's pride in a very creditable manner. They are a splendid advertisement for the local show, for Leslie's Weekly is read over all the world.

Two Redskins in Court. Narcisse McKay, renowned Indian buckaroo, who made a remarkable showing at the Round-Up, was arrested last night for being drunk and this morning forfeited his \$5 bail. William Switzer, another Indian, was picked up for a similar offense and was forced to go to jail for three days.

Boston Restaurant is Sold. Jack Ryan, well known waiter in the French restaurant, bid in the Boston restaurant this afternoon when it was auctioned off by Deputy Sheriff Blakeley at a sheriff's sale. The price paid was \$400 above the claims held against it, the whole amounting to \$877.70. The restaurant was closed during the Round-Up when one of the Greek proprietors ran off with heavy receipts.

Court Considers Drainage District. The county court is holding an adjourned session today to reconsider the report on the assessments made in the recently created drainage district at Stanfield. In a few days a notice will be posted announcing that the court will sit as a board of equalization to consider complaints on Friday, Nov. 3.

Berger Still Pitching Ball. Joe Berger, Pendleton's premier mound artist of last season, is still pitching championship ball. Last Friday he was imported by Pineville sports to pitch a game against a Portland team and he won a home in the inland town by winning his game 3 to 1, not only twirling superb ball but bringing in two of the runs with a two bagger and a three bagger.

Water Turned in Sewer. Mayor E. J. Murphy announced this morning that water was turned into the pipes of the sewer extension at 6 o'clock last evening. This means that the promise made by the city to the state that the outlet of the Pendleton sewer system would be extended to below the asylum site has been fulfilled.

Two Marriage Licenses. A marriage license was issued yesterday afternoon to Len F. Collins and Thea Dulles and Mrs. Eva Pruntye of Pendleton and the couple were married yesterday evening at the Methodist parsonage, Rev. N. Evans officiating. Another license was issued today to Henry Collins and Bertha Alexander, both of this city, and the marriage ceremony will be performed this evening.

Umatilla to Have Fire Limits. Attorney Frederick Steiner, who is acting as city attorney for Umatilla, announces that he has prepared an ordinance establishing fire limits in the railroad town. New modern brick buildings, which have just been constructed in Umatilla, have awakened the residents to the fact that measures should be taken to safeguard the business section of their town.

Sleeping Car Was Rattled. With one side badly battered "amidships" the Pullman standard sleeper Miramon is on the sidetrack in the O.-W. R. & N. yard today and the condition of the car has attracted considerable interest. The car was damaged at Gibbon night before last when the train to which it was attached was standing upon a sidetrack. Through a mistake on the part of a trainman a box car was allowed to collide with the sleeper and it hit with a jolt that smashed in the car and raked it from end to end.

Hunting Parties In and Out. Hardly a day passes now without some of the local nimrods journeying out to the fields where lurks the wild game. A party consisting of J. J. Hamley, Dan Bowman and John Hamley, Jr., returned this morning from Prospect farm, where they bagged 32 geese yesterday. Another party consisting of Dr. H. S. Garfield, Carl Long and Bert Livermore left this morning for the LaZinka ranch where they expect to have good luck.

STARVING CREW IS TAKEN OFF WRECK

Captain and Eleven Men Cling to Schooner's Rigging for Days Without Food.

Seattle.—The Globe Navigation company's schooner Nottingham, from Westport, Wash., for Callao, with lumber, was dismasted last Sunday off the Oregon coast during a terrific gale. Captain A. W. Svenson and his crew of 11 men clung to the rigging without food until they were taken off by the schooner David Evans. The men suffered greatly from exposure. There was abundance of provisions in the hold of the Nottingham, but the vessel was so completely waterlogged that the food could not be reached even after the storm moderated. The Nottingham is drifting a helpless wreck in the track of sailing vessels off the coast of Oregon. The Nottingham is noted for a cruise around the world which she made two years ago, and during which she was obliged to put in Bermuda and Melbourne to repair damage caused by storm.

DOG'S PROTEST ENDS WHISTLE SHRIEKING

Mourful Howling Brings Action From Neighbors; Engines Now Toot Gently.

Denver.—There is a certain aristocratic and highly strung cocker spaniel in Denver who may just be classed with the most successful workers for social reform in the city. Single voiced he entered a vigorous protest against the bad habits of railroad locomotives which shriek and wail at unseemly hours of the night. From this protest arose a great popular demand, and "Thanatopsis," as the cocker spaniel is called, forced the rich and powerful railroad to capitulate.

Secretary James R. Noland of the Fire and Police Board has been extremely busy of late filing away letters from high railroad officials begging that their regrets be conveyed to Thanatopsis, and promising that the whistling of locomotives shall be permitted only when absolutely necessary.

The proud owner of Thanatopsis made the first complaint to the Fire and Police Board. He is a very well-known Denverite, a former politician and state official of wealth and influence.

He appeared before Secretary Noland one day and said: "Can't you make these railroads stop blowing train whistles at all hours of the night and morning. Some engineer will start his whistle going about 5 o'clock in the morning and continue it for half an hour. It disturbs my dog, who is very sensitive. He begins to howl, to howl fearfully and dreadfully."

WILD DOVE ESCORTS BISHOP TO ALTER

Unique Incident Marks Dedication of Spokane Edifice.

Spokane, Wash.—When Very Rev. Edward J. O'Dea, S. J., bishop of the diocese of Nesqually, entered the nave of St. Aloysius Catholic church here at the head of a procession of visiting bishops and priests and 80 acolytes to perform the dedicatory ceremonies the morning of Columbus day, he was greeted by a wild dove, which, after circling above his head, sought shelter in the rafters. Whence the bird came or how it gained admission to the church could not be explained by Father P. J. Arthus, procurator of the province of California, who had personal charge of the building operations.

Bishop O'Dea performed the pontifical high mass, in which he was assisted by visiting priests. Very Rev. James A. Rockeliffe, S. J., provincial of the province of California, preached the dedicatory sermon. The music was supplied by a large choir and the Gonzaga college orchestra. Afterward the visitors were entertained at a banquet in the college hall, where Bishop O'Dea presided.

The edifice, which is 190 feet in length, 110 feet in width at the transepts and 124 feet in height, with two spires, each of 164 feet, surmounted by electrically lighted crosses, was erected at a cost of \$180,000, exclusive of site and was built by day labor under the direction of Father Arthus, who says there was not an accident of any kind during the construction period.

The elaborately paneled arch of the auditorium is 50 feet above the floor, which will accommodate 1,100, the seating capacity of the gallery being 250. The structure, which was erected in less than two years, is declared by architects and builders to be the most modern and complete of its kind in the intermountain country.
