> The edifice, which is 190 feet in length, 110 feet in width at the transcepts and 124 feet in height, with two spires, each of 164 feet, surmounted by electrically lighted crosses, was erected at a cost of \$180,000. exclusive of site and was built by day labor under the direction of Father Arthuis, who says there was not an accident of any kind during the construction period.

The elaborately paneled arch of the auditorium is 50 feet above the floor, which will accommodate 1,100, the seating capacity of the gallery being 250. The structure, which was erected in less than two years, is declared by architects and builders to be the most modern and complete of its kind in the intermountain country.
