Spot Wheat Is Strongest. Chicago, Oct. 18.—Foreign cables were weak and lower yesterday, influencing the Chicago wheat market to drop at the opening. For the December there was an initial loss of 1-4c and in the May 1-5c. Closing was better all around with December 7-8c higher and May and July 1-8c to 1-4c better than yesterday, respectively. There was better buying of cash wheat at milling centers and both Duluth and Minneapolis reported a higher price.
