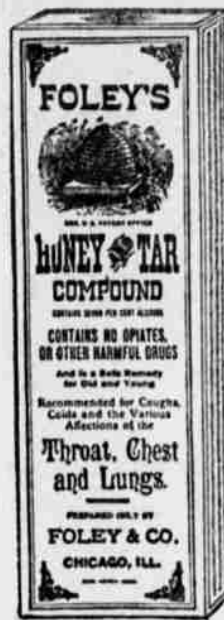

CATTLE MARKET IS VERY ERRATIC

TRADE WONDERING WHAT VALUES WILL BE

Six Calves Represent Yesterday's Receipts at North Portland—Loss Very Slight So Far—Hogs Sell at Top Notch—Lamb Shows Better.

As compared with yesterday's liberal offerings in all lines of livestock the small movement in the North Portland yards this morning was the extreme. All told there were only 48 hogs, 6 calves and 142 sheep reported in.

Since the big run of calves yesterday the trade has been given cause to wonder what the immediate future of values would be. Late yesterday afternoon the market was very erratic and while some steers sold as high as \$5.75 others of equal quality, according to sellers, sold at \$5.50 and \$5.65 respectively.

The way that packers took hold of the immense run of yesterday, cleaning up entirely, gives evidence of the great strength through which the cattle trade is passing at this time. Never before has such a big lot of cattle passed through the pens to the scales and left the price so near the former top.

The loss in cattle values during the past 24 hours has been slight. As stated in The Journal yesterday afternoon, prices were but 10c to 15c under the extreme top of the past few days. This showing is remarkable and shows that the Portland market is growing. A few years ago a run of half that number of cattle would have swamped the trade even during times of great strength and yet during the past 24 hours the entire shipment was sold with scarcely a sign of trouble.

CHOP MILL MOVED FROM HERMISTON TO STANFIELD

Portland Ore., Nov. 8.—Charley Bennett, a Umatilla Indian, is being made to serve time in the county jail because he is the lawful owner of real estate in the Umatilla reservation allotment. NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT.

Notice is hereby given, that the Common Council did on October 25, 1911, pass the following resolution, and that the surveyor's estimate of the proportion of the cost of the improvement as mentioned therein, to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land, is now on file in my office, said resolution being as follows: to-wit:

Whereas the city surveyor did on October 25, 1911, under direction of the Common Council, file plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Washington street from a point 100 feet east of the east line of Garfield street to the west line of Blaine street, Blaine street from the north line of Washington street to a point 200 feet north of the north line of Washington street, together with the estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, together with a statement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and percentage of the total cost of the improvement which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived therefrom; and Whereas the Common Council has examined such plans and specifications and found the same satisfactory and the estimates for the work to be done in accordance with the probable cost thereof; and

Whereas, the property recommended by the city surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is, in the judgment of the Common Council, properly to be included within such district, and no property is excluded therefrom which should properly be included therein; and

Whereas, the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of said streets by grading and constructing sidewalks and crosswalks along the north side of such portion of Washington street and the west side of such portion of Blaine street where there are at present no sidewalks or where the sidewalks are not constructed according to the ordinances of the City of Pendleton, the same is, in the judgment of the Common Council, at this time necessary; therefore,

Be It Resolved, by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton that it is expedient to improve and it is hereby proposed to improve Washington street, in the City of Pendleton, from a point 100 feet east of the east line of Garfield street to the west line of Blaine street, and Blaine street from the north line of Washington street to a point 200 feet north of the north line of Washington street, by making excavations and fills thereon and rolling the same with the city road roller, so as to make an even and compact surface upon the established grade of said streets and constructing sidewalks and crosswalks along the north side of such portion of Washington street and the west side of such portion of Blaine street where there are at present no sidewalks or where the sidewalks are not constructed according to the ordinances of the City of Pendleton, according to the plans and specifications therefor prepared by the city surveyor and filed with the recorder of the City of Pendleton on the 25th day of October, 1911; and

Be It Further Resolved, That the plans, specifications and estimates for such improvement, as so prepared by the city surveyor and so filed on the 25th day of October, be and they are hereby approved.

Be It Further Resolved, That the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land especially benefited by such improvement, proportionately as so benefited and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land so especially benefited shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof in proportion as they are so especially benefited.

And Be It Further Resolved, That an assessment district is hereby created, embracing the property to be assessed for the payment of such improvement, which assessment district shall include the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the center of Block 4, Livermore's Addition to the City of Pendleton Oregon. Thence north along the center line of Blocks 4 and 5 in said addition to the center of Block 5. Thence west along the center line of Blocks 5, 2 and B in said addition to the southwest corner of Lot 3 of said Block B. Thence north 50 feet to the northwest corner of Lot 3 in said Block B. Thence west to the northwest corner of Lot 3 in Block 6, Cole's Addition to the City of Pendleton, Oregon. Thence south to the southwest corner of Lot 3, Block 13, of said Cole's Addition. Thence east along the center line of said Block 13 of Cole's Addition and Blocks C, 3 and 4 of said Livermore's Addition, to the place of beginning.

And Be It Further Resolved, That a copy of this resolution, together with a notice that the surveyor's estimate of the proportion of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land, is on file in the office of the City Recorder, be published for a period of ten days in the East Oregonian, which newspaper is hereby designated by the Common Council for the publication thereof.
