PORTLAND LIVESTOCK SHOWING SMALL

CATTLEMEN REALIZE MARKET IS ADVERSE TO THEM

Holding Stock for More Favorable Conditions—Mutton Maintains a Very Firm Tone—Swine Show Fractional Loss—Wheat Depressed.

(From Tuesday's Journal.) All through the livestock market there was only a small showing of supplies this morning. Receipts in the cattle yards are beginning to fall off. Shippers have at last begun to realize that conditions are adverse to them at this time. For that reason they are inclined to withhold their stock until assured of a better demand. At the present time there is none in the cattle division. While some sales are made, they are forced and therefore shippers must naturally expect to receive shaded figures. On the basis of sales made yesterday afternoon at a late hour the cattle market has suffered but little from the over full condition of the trade. Had this happened anywhere else but North Portland it is not likely that shippers would have been so fortunate. With fancy steers selling as high as \$5.50 on a congested trade it is not a very bad position to realize when the market adjusts itself again. North Portland cattle market range:
