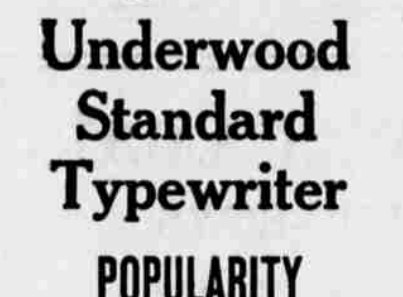

JUDGE LOWELL SUBMITS HIS VIEWS

ATTACKS RECORD OF PRESENT SENATOR FROM OREGON

Believes Business Should Be Divorced from Politics, Elimination of Lobbyist from Capitol, Dislocation of Trusts and Canal Fortifications.

To the Republicans of Oregon: At the next state primary election, April 19, 1912, there will be nominated candidates for United States senator to succeed Jonathan Bourne, Jr., whose term expires March 4, 1913.

The Oregon system of government has become a fixture in our civic life, and is no longer an issue here. Having had full part in its adoption and defense (except as to statement No. 1, which until expressly construed by the people, I regarded as applicable within party lines), I endorse its wisdom.

Public sentiment is now focused upon more comprehensive questions, and a senator of the United States during the next decade will be confronted with graver problems than have demanded attention since the civil war.

Business must be divorced from politics, and the lobbyist driven from the portals of the capitol. The trusts must be dissolved, but without destroying the industrial and commercial fabric of the nation.

I assume that at this late date no other republican candidate is likely to enter the field and therefore I extend to Senator Bourne an invitation to discuss with me upon the public platforms of Oregon during any two weeks of the primary campaign.

I have been a resident of Oregon for nearly twenty-one years, am familiar with its resources and its needs, and know what its people have a right to demand of the general government.

Disclaiming all intention to cast any personal reflection upon the man, and speaking only of his public record, which in every candidate is a proper subject of discussion, I oppose Mr. Bourne's re-election for the following reasons:

First—I do not regard him as a bona fide resident of Oregon. In the last campaign reputable speakers asserted that he maintained no home within the state, and the assertion was never denied.

Second—He is apparently more closely identified with Massachusetts than with Oregon. He is the head of one of the great cotton manufacturing concerns of New England, heavily protected by the tariff laws, and said to yield immense revenues.
