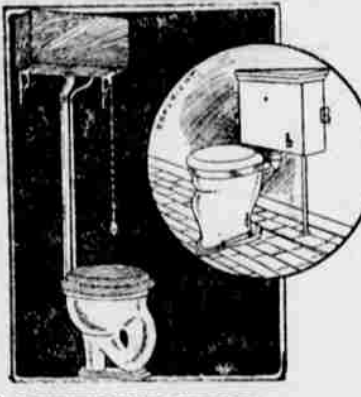

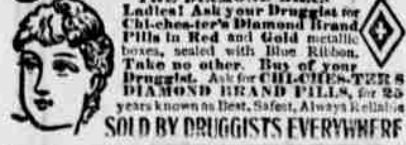

LOWELL MAY BE ONLY G. O. P. OPPONENT

Near the end of Judge Stephen A. Lowell's announcement of his candidacy for United States senator, issued a few days ago, he observed: "I assume that at this late date no other republican candidate is likely to enter the field."
