

### PORTLAND LIVESTOCK MARKET IS STEADY

CONDITIONS LITTLE CHANGED FROM THOSE OF LAST WEEK

Top for Hogs is Good—Fair Showing in Cattle Division and Prices are Steady—Heldover Sheep Find Buyers—Wheat Shows Decline.

(From Monday's Journal.) Conditions in the livestock market at North Portland continue steady with prices practically on the same basis as ruled during the latter part of last week.

There was a very fair showing of local hogs in the yards this morning, a total of 362 head being received over Sunday compared with 700 head for the same day last week.

Top hogs continue to sell at \$6.75 in the North Portland market; this basis price being paid for several small lots. Heavier stuff went at \$6.65.

North Portland swine trade today: Best eastern Oregon \$6.75; Medium eastern Oregon 6.65@6.70; Best Willamette valley 6.60@6.70; Good to heavy 6.55; Feeders 6.50@6.85.

Cattle Market Steady. There was quite a fair showing of cattle in the North Portland pens today but the trade held rather steady, close to the previous range.

Offerings over Sunday were 223 head compared with 632 head last Monday. Steers sold this morning at \$5.65 and cows went at \$4.65 at the same time.

There was a good tone for bulls and while only one animal went at \$4.75, the market all through was good.

At Chicago there was a good tone for best while others were weak. North Portland general cattle range:

### French Breakfast Rolls

(Recipe by Mrs. Sara Tyson Rorer) One pint milk; two ounces Cottolene; one teaspoonful salt; one pound flour; one egg; one-half cup yeast, or one-half cake yeast dissolved. Scald the milk and cut into it the Cottolene, add salt, and when cool sift in the flour; add a well-beaten egg and the yeast. Beat well and stand in a warm place over night. In the morning form into little rolls, handling as little as possible, adding a very little flour. Place each roll in a French roll pan, stand in warm place three-quarters of an hour and bake in quick oven about fifteen minutes. ### MAY HOLD ALL MINERALS

Committee May Go Further on Alaska Lands Than Fisher. Washington.—On the ground that the administration has substantially changed its announced Alaskan policy, Attorney Louis D. Brandeis, counsel for the house committee on interior department expenditures, has advised Chairman Graham that no further action by that committee is investigating Controller bay affairs is necessary.

Chairman Graham said the committee very materially aided in effecting this change of policy, and added: "The committee may go further than Secretary of the Interior Fisher and recommend retaining to the government the title to all the mineral, gas and oil lands in Alaska."
