(Recipe by Mrs. Sara Tyson Rorer)
One pint milk; two ounces Cottolene;
one tenspoonful salt; one pound flour;
one egg; one-half cup yeast, or one-half
cake yeast dissolved.

Scald the milk and cut into it the Cottolene, add sait, and when cool sift in the flour; add a well-beaten egg and the yeast. Beat well and stand in a warm place over night. In the morning form into little rolls, handling as little as possible, adding a very little flour. Place each roll in a French roll pan, stand in warm place three-quarters of an hour and bake in quick oven about fifteen minutes.


