of the sale of "Bill Taft," the wonderful steer brought from Baker and which sold to the Union Meat company at \$217, or 10c per pound. Further sales of holiday stuff continue and prices naturally much higher than are being paid for what is ordinarily considered top quality. The stuff selling for holidays is still dead, while others are merely hay stuff. Therefore prices should not be confused. Only the latter are quoted in the regular range cattle prices by the Journal at this time.

There was another fair run of cattle in the yards today, but little of the stock could be called first class after having exhibited the stock that arrived yesterday. Nevertheless one lot of 18 cows brought \$5 this morning. These averaged 1026 and were very desirable for the holiday trade. Three calves that averaged 160 pounds went to the high mark at \$8.

Best Steers \$5.75. What is ordinarily called "best" in the steer division is not being quoted above \$5.75 by the local trade. Stock that brings more than this figure is generally grain fed and prepared especially for the holiday market. Today's run of 208 head in the cattle division at North Portland compares with 59 head last Tuesday.

Hog Market Mixed. The sale of the big lot of contract hogs at North Portland yesterday has been somewhat understood. While the transaction was at \$7.10, this did not mean that stuff sold in the regular way would bring that figure. The stock was sold prior to arrival and was weighed without the usual fill. This means fully 15c above the previous price.

As a general rule local interests are not quoting hogs above \$6.85. Run for the day was 167 head compared with 292 last Tuesday. There remains an excellent situation in the mutton yards at North Portland. Receipts for the day were 491 head compared with 477 a week ago.

While good stock is in firm request at the most favorable values, there remains a stagnant tone for poor stuff. Some of the late arrivals would be worth more money in the interior than here for they are reshipped.

Pay Head to Wheat Damage. Chicago, Dec. 13.—The wheat trade paid head to the damage to the grain crop by rains in Argentina and the market advanced from 5-8 to 7-8c at the closing after an opening unchanged to 1-2c higher. The advance in Buenos Ayres was the basis for a further stiffening of values at Liverpool and Paris, but at Berlin the market reacted.

Minneapolis reported a better demand for cash wheat. The Chicago cash wheat market was firm with prices unchanged.
