CHRISTMAS BEEF MAKES PRICE RECORD

ALL PREVIOUS SALES AT PORTLAND ARE ECLIPSED

Ordinary Beef Cattle Are Firm—Hogs Show Weak Tendency—Sheep Are Firm and Higher—Chicago Wheat Shows Advance.

High class Christmas beef is showing a monopoly of the movement at North Portland at this time. The honors are taken by S. C. Oxman of Durkee and A. H. Barnum of Moro. Mr. Oxman has the honor of obtaining the highest price ever received in the Portland stockyards for finished cattle, while Mr. Barnum receives the credit for inaugurating the raising of baby beef of quality, which invariably sells at a much higher price than does ordinarily called fancy quality or 3-year-olds.

Sales of steers were made this morning as high as \$10 per hundred pounds, this value being received by Mr. Oxman for two animals that weighed 1540 and 1320 pounds respectively. The same shipper sold another animal at \$9 and still another at \$8.

Such a lot of high priced stuff has never before been seen at North Portland, but the trade took hold and paid prices with practically no delay.

Ordinary Cattle Firm.
The big movement of high class cattle has given the impression in some quarters that the market is extremely high for ordinary offerings, but this is not the case. Trade in the cattle market at North Portland is firm for all offerings, but it is doubtful if the run of what is ordinarily called "top" steers would bring above \$5.75 at this time despite the fact that some extra fancy stuff sold at almost twice this figure.

Hogs Weak But Unchanged.
There was a weak tone in the hog market today with no change in prices. The 99 head that arrived sold at \$6.65, but this continues the extreme top of the trade at Portland and only selected offerings would bring that figure.

Sheep Firm and Higher.
Market for sheep and lambs is firmer and higher at North Portland. Sales made during the day were generally at an advance of 10 to 15c over previous transactions. There was a fair showing of supplies in the yards this morning and therefore killers took hold quickly at the higher range. Quality was likewise good and this was a help.

Hay—Producers' price—1911 crop—Valley timothy, fancy, \$15.00; ordinary, \$13.00; eastern Oregon, \$16.50; Idaho, \$17; mixed, \$12.00; clover, \$10.00; wheat, \$11; cheat, \$11; alfalfa, \$12.00; oats, \$11.

Chicago Shorts Covering.
Chicago, Dec. 15.—Shorts became frightened at the general advance in foreign wheat prices, due to the severe rain fall in the wheat country of Argentina.

The heavy advance at Buenos Ayres the lack of offerings there together with the sharply higher prices throughout Europe, did not fail to cause shorts to look more to their safety.

Wheat opened here at an advance of 1-4 to 3-8c and closed with a rise of 1-3-8 to 1-5-8c above yesterday.

There is a strengthening of cash wheat prices at home. At Minneapolis millers were reported as liberal buyers of cereal.
