RICHESON REPORTED DESERTED BY EDMONDS

Father of Accused Minister's One-Time Fiancee Won't Deny or Comment on Rumor.

Boston.—There was a report that Moses Grant Edmonds had withdrawn all financial support from his one-time prospective son-in-law, the Rev. Clarence V. T. Richeson, awaiting trial for the murder of Avis Linnell.

"I have nothing to say concerning Mr. Richeson," said Mr. Edmonds.

"Will you deny that you have withdrawn your support from him?"

"I will not deny it. I have nothing to say."

None of the Edmonds family has called at the Charles Street jail for six weeks. Previous to that time Mr. Edmonds made several calls and carried the clergyman food and clothing. For six weeks Richeson has been eating the jail food. Even on Thanksgiving day he had nothing but the scant pork dinner prepared for all prisoners.

Of late the pastor has shown the effects of being confined in jail and is said to have become disheartened over the attitude of his intimate friends, many of the latter having ceased their visits.

William A. Morse, chief counsel for Richeson, was out of town today. He is the only one in the case who can speak with authority upon the matter.

Chief Justice Aiken of the Superior Court will on Monday announce the

name of the judge who will preside over the trial, which is scheduled to begin Jan. 15. It is understood that counsel for the accused minister will again ask for an extension of time. It is believed that either Judge Sanderson or Judge Stevens will try Richeson. Judge Sanderson has heard all matters pertaining to the Richeson case so far in the upper court.

FEAR SELF-HYPNOTISM IS KILLING ALLEGED POISONER

Found Suffering From Paralysis in Chicago Jail, and Her Condition is Critical.

Chicago.—Mrs. Louis Vermilya, charged with having poisoned Police Officer Arthur Blissette and suspected of having poisoned nine others, was found stricken with paralysis by a matron, and Dr. Thomas Hogan, physician, at the county jail, where she is imprisoned, says her condition is critical.

Dr. Hogan is of the belief that she is the victim of self-hypnotism.

"She is a powerful woman with a powerful mind," said he. "I am of the opinion that she has brought her trouble on by will power. Death may come at any moment. She cannot talk and only has the use of her right hand."

Mrs. Vermilya was arrested on a charge of murder when an examination of the viscera of the policeman revealed sufficient arsenic to cause death. The deaths of nine other persons within a few years caused Coroner Hoffman to exhume the bodies of two. Traces of arsenic were found in each.

GEORGE J. GOULD JERKS LORD DECIES OUT OF PERIL

Family Party Just Escapes Being Run Down by a Cab Driver in Washington.

Washington.—George J. Gould, his son Jay Gould, Lord and Lady Decies and Mr. Russell, a friend of Mr. Gould, narrowly escaped being run down on Pennsylvania avenue by a cab driver.

Mr. Gould and his party were en route from New York to High Point, N. C., and had stopped off in Washington to get a terrapin and canvas bag dinner. After dinner the party started to walk back to the Willard. As they were crossing Pennsylvania avenue at Thirteenth street a cab driver headed toward the party. Lady Decies, who was in the lead with his lordship, stepped back, but not her husband, who stood stock still. Just as the horse was about to strike him George Gould grabbed him by the arm and not very gently jerked him out of danger.

STORK OVERTAKES A FLYER.

Baby Girl Born on Fast Train to Manager of Chicago Opera.

Chicago.—The stork delivered a fine baby girl to Mrs. Bernard Ulrich in a drawing room on the Pennsylvania eighteen-hour train sixty miles outside of Chicago.

Mrs. Ulrich, who is the wife of the manager of the Chicago Grand Opera company, had left Baltimore, where she had been visiting relatives, yesterday about noon. She was accompanied by a maid and a trained nurse from the Johns Hopkins Hospital.
