STATE'S INCREASE IN POPULATION GOOD

GAINS 62 PER CENT AS AGAINST 21 FOR NATION

Oregon's Citizenship Grows More Than Twice As Fast As Average of Other Commonwealths - History Repeats Itself.

Washington, Dec. 28.—The population of Oregon, now 672,765, as enumerated at the 13th census, April 15, 1910, and compared with one of 413,536 in 1890, increased 62.7 per cent in the decade. The figures are given in a special bulletin of the department of commerce and labor on the population of Oregon, which has just been published here.

During the decade 1900-10 the total population of continental United States increased by 21 per cent and the growth of the state was a little more than twice as rapid as during the preceding decade, 1890-1900, when the rate of increase was 30.2 per cent.

Oregon was organized as a territory in 1848 and appears in the federal census reports for the first time in 1850. The total population (13,294) reported for 1850 includes 1201 returned for that portion which was taken in 1853 to form Washington territory. During each decade since 1850 the state has shown a rapid growth, the lowest rate of increase for any decennial period being 30.2 per cent for the decade 1890-1900. The most rapid rate of growth was naturally during the first few years in the history of the state, the population increasing threefold from 1850 to 1860. During the three following decades, 1860-1890, the population of the state increased more than fivefold, the percentages of increase ranging from 73.3 to 92.2. Between 1890 and 1910 the population more than doubled. The numerical increase during the last decade was nearly one and one-half times the entire population of the state in 1880.

A comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for continental United States, as given in the preceding table shows that during every decade covered by the table the growth of the state was more rapid than the growth of the country as a whole. The population of the state in 1910 was somewhat more than 50 times as large as in 1850, while the population of continental United States in 1910 was slightly less than four times that in 1850.

Oregon has 97 cities, of which Portland, the largest, has a population of 207,214, and Salem, the second city, a population of 14,094. There are also five cities having from 5000 to 10,000, nine having from 2500 to 5000, and 81 having less than 2500 inhabitants.

Portland, Salem, Eugene, Medford and Ashland show very high rates of increase for the last decade, ranging from 90.5 per cent in Ashland to 83.4 per cent in Medford. Baker shows the lowest rate of increase, namely, 1.2 per cent. During the preceding decade, however, there was a marked growth in the population of this city, the percentage of increase being 15.9.

PURE FOOD DEPARTMENT TESTS 9500 SAMPLES

Washington.—Inspectors of the Bureau of chemistry, under the supervision of Dr. Harvey W. Wiley, the pure food expert, collected 9,500 samples of foods and drugs during the past year, according to the report of the bureau just made public.

Of the 9,500 foods and drugs seized the bureau found only 3280 to be legal as compared with 3113 which were found to be misbranded and adulterated. Five hundred and three check analyses were made to insure that correct results were obtained before recommendations were made as to the method of procedure by the department for the violations.

There were 5370 hearings held by the bureau on questionable products of which over half were made at New York. A total of 9697 imported foods and drugs were analyzed and 2085 were found adulterated or misbranded. The miscellaneous samples which come under the examination of the pure food experts aggregated 1406, making a total of 18,000 samples.

TO TEST SANITY OF MAN WHO SHOT MAYOR GAYNOR

It is Said Gallagher is Dying of Paralysis—Two Physicians Are to Examine Him.

Trenton.—By order of the county court two physicians are to test the sanity of James J. Gallagher, who shot Mayor Gaynor and Commissioner Edwards of New York on the ship the mayor was taking for Europe.

This action was taken with the approval of Dr. Thomas H. Mackenzie, the visiting physician of the prison, as it is asserted that Gallagher has paralysis, will not live more than a year and should be transferred to the state hospital for the insane.

When Gallagher was tried for shooting Commissioner Edwards, Dr. Henry A. Cotton, head of the state hospital for the insane at Trenton; Dr. S. Smith of Bayonne and Dr. Arlie

and Dr. McGill of Hoboken, testified that he had paralysis. Dr. Allen McLane Hamilton and Dr. McDonald combated this testimony.

THAW TO RENEW HIS FIGHT FOR FREEDOM

Attorney for Slayer of Stanford White Declares That His Client is Same Now.

Poughkeepsie, N. Y.—That proceedings will be started before spring to obtain the release of Harry K. Thaw from the Mattawan state hospital was learned on good authority.

Charles Morschauser, attorney for Thaw, admitted that he and Clarence J. Shearn, who is associated with him in the case, have been in conference over plans for a move to free Thaw, but declined to commit himself regarding the basis for the next fight.

Asked as to the truth of his report that Thaw would make the acquittal of Mrs. O'Shaughnessy, in New York city recently, a basis for his claim for freedom, Morschauser replied that Thaw's freedom would be asked for because he is sane.

"Thaw was acquitted because he was insane when he killed Stanford White," said Morschauser. "He is now as sane as any man, and should not be held a prisoner for an act committed in a fit of insanity several years ago, for which a jury acquitted him."

Morschauser would not say when he would ask for the next writ of habeas corpus for Thaw, but others in touch with the situation say Thaw will make his next move before May 1.
