Salem, Or., Jan. 2 .- Several decisions of great interest to water users have been handed down by the supreme court recently, which will be of great assistance to the board of control, in passing upon questions appertaining to water rights in adjudi-cations pending before it. The case of McCoy vs. Huntley, appealed from Wheeler county, is the first case in this state which recognizes what is known as the rotation system among appropriators; that is, where the court's decree requires a use of the water by the appropriators alternately, for stated periods of time, in proportion to their respective rights of
