GREEKS ROBBED BY FELLOW COUNTRYMAN

STANFIELD AUTHORITIES LOOK UNSUCCESSFULLY FOR CULPRIT

Work Renewed on Drainage Tunnel Under Railroad—Sportsmen Believe Open Season on Ducks in Umatilla Is Too Long.

Stanfield, Ore., Jan. 20.—There is great grief among the Greeks at this point who are employed on the section work of the O.-W. R. & N. Co. because of the hasty departure during the wee sma' hours of Thursday night of one of their countrymen who took with him a sum of money said to be about \$30 which belonged to them. Efforts are being made to locate the culprit but thus far without success.

Duck Season Too Long.

There has been considerable discussion here in regard to the open season for duck shooting. The season in Clatsop, Columbia and Multnomah counties closes Jan. 15th, while in Umatilla, Grant, Harney, Malheur, Morrow, Union and Walla Walla counties the season remains open from September 1st to April 1st. This is considered by many of the local sportsmen to be entirely too long an open season and the opinion seems to prevail that the season in these counties should close a month or two earlier. Some authorities claim that the ducks begin mating in Umatilla county as early as February and if this is really true there should be a shortening of the open season in order that good shooting may be assured for future years.

Work on Tunnel Renewed.

The O.-W. R. & N. company bridge crew that came here a few days ago to assist in the construction of the tunnel under the track for the crossing of the drainage ditch which is being put in by Eschbach, Bruce Co., for the Umatilla Drainage district of Stanfield, has been held up for several days awaiting the arrival of some special timbers that were necessary for the work. These timbers were received this morning and the work is now being pushed forward with all possible haste and it is expected that the contractors will have the tunnel finished so as to start their big drag line machine to work early next week. They were obliged to wait for the putting in of the tunnel before they could start the machine.

The basketball game which was to have been played here last night between the Stanfield and Hermiston teams was postponed until next Friday on account of the illness of two of the members of the Stanfield team.
