## LIVESTOCK MARKET IS MORE STEADY

### BEARISHNESS IN SWINE DIVISION IS DISAPPEARING

No Cattle Received at North Portland and Shippers Advised to Starve Market to Better Prices—Sheep Trade Good.

(From Wednesday's Journal.) The bearishness in the hog market at points east of the Rockies is fast disappearing, leaving in its place a tone of restfulness which would bring forth a better range.

There was only a small offering of hogs at North Portland today and some of these came direct to a local meat company. The market for hogs here is still out of line with the price of provisions.

Run at North Portland for the day was 160 head, compared with 290 last Wednesday.

Turner of Louisville will recover \$1200 worth of jewelry. The authorities have identified Mrs. Turner and the jewels will be sent to Kentucky. ### JAIL FOR RUSSIAN SPIES.

Three Years Imprisonment Is Penalty for Zar's Lieutenant and Aid. Leipzig, Germany.—Sentences were

imposed on two spies by the imperial supreme court. Baron Vinogradoff, lieutenant in the Russian navy, and Lieutenant von Cerno, belonging to the reserve of the Hungarian army, were both condemned to three years' imprisonment.

Baron Vinogradoff will be confined in a fortress, but von Cerno will serve his term in an ordinary penitentiary.

The espionage of which they were convicted was connected with naval matters. Baron Vinogradoff was detailed to supervise the operations of von Cerno.

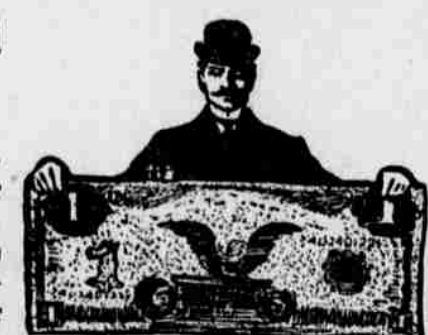
