### CATTLE MARKET BADLY CONGESTED

SHIPPERS CAN MAKE MONEY BY HOLDING SHIPMENTS  
Prices Are Extremely Low—Hog Situation Also Very Weak—Sheep Are Holding Firm—Chicago Wheat Is Depressed.

(From Friday's Journal.)  
There was weakness in the only lines that showed offerings at North Portland today. The extent of the congestion in the cattle trade is much greater than had been anticipated and shippers at this time or within the immediate future are really making money if they would keep their stuff at home.  
The congested state of the local trade may be shown when it is noted that leading local killers have practically all the cattle they need for slaughter within the next three weeks. On top of this must be added the arrivals that will come forward during that period, making a rather dubious outlook for prices within the next month or so.

Prices obtained in the cattle market during the past 24 hours are misleading in the extreme. For instance a bunch of fancy cows that were reported sold yesterday at \$5.25 were in reality not sold at all then, but three weeks ago. On the basis of what other stuff was selling at yesterday and today, this stock would have experienced difficulty in ranging up to \$5.  
\$5.75 Extreme Top for Cattle.  
The extreme top for cattle today at North Portland is \$5.75. Fancy grain fed steers that would have readily moved a few weeks ago as high as \$6.50 are not bringing above the lower figure now, and buyers are in no great hurry to take hold at that figure.

There was another enormous run of cattle in the local market today but the bulk of the shipments were going to Puget sound, having been purchased in the country by northern packers. Therefore they were merely watered and rested here to satisfy the provisions of the stock law.

of cattle in Montana and Wyoming. The outlook for shipments from this territory is not bright, especially as the immediate wants of home killers were taken care of some time ago. Thirty-two cars out of total arrivals of 38 cars that came forward today to North Portland were direct shipments to Puget sound killers. Of this amount 21 cars came from Wyoming direct and 11 loads from Idaho. All but one car of the day's total arrivals came from outside of the state. This was a load of cattle from Pendleton.

Hog Market Is Weak.  
Weak prices are shown in the hog trade at North Portland for the day. There were no arrivals available for the market one car going through to Puget sound, while there were eight loads from Nebraska, which went direct to local killers.

The last sales of hogs at North Portland, which were late yesterday afternoon, went at \$6.60. On the basis of the South Omaha market today the eight loads that came forward to killers cost them \$7.25 to land here. Therefore they are today offering 65c per 100 pounds more for Nebraska swine than they are for local hogs of equal quality. This is causing much dissatisfaction among local producers, as well as receivers.

Chicago, Jan. 27.—Price of wheat was depressed yesterday after an opening that was fractionally higher. Closing was unchanged to 1-4c lower than Thursday. There was an advance of 1-8c each in May and July, and a loss of 3-8c each in the September at the opening this morning.
