

# CATTLE MARKET DECLINES SLIGHTLY

## RECEIVERS FORCE KILLERS TO TAKE UP SHIPMENTS

No Arrivals in Hog Division and Market is Nominal—Sheep Situation is Stationary—Wheat Shorts Again Scared.

(From Friday's Journal.) Utah cattle were offering in the North Portland market today. Six loads arrived from there this morning, three loads each being received from Logan and Lewiston. The cattle were from the best sugar districts and were fattened upon the pulp waste of the sugar plant.

Total arrivals in the cattle market today were seven loads, or 197 head, together with 4 head of calves. No shipments were received from this state.

As a rule the cattle market at North Portland is being quoted at a decline of 5c to 10c from previous prices, with buyers seemingly forced by receivers to take hold at the figure.

**LEADER IN SPANISH SWINDLE IDENTIFIED**

Memphis, Tenn., Man Picks Out Picture of Hotelkeeper, Who Mulcted Him of Several Thousands.  
Memphis, Tenn.—According to R. D. Jones, of Memphis, Gracias Jimi-

nez, under arrest at Madrid, Spain, is the ringleader of a band of men who fleeced Jones of several thousand dollars by means of the so-called "Spanish swindle."

Jones has identified the picture of Jiminez as that of the man to whom he paid the sum declared necessary to effect the release of a supposed Russian banker, languishing in prison, notwithstanding the fact that secreted in his baggage were many thousands of dollars.

Jones says, after he paid the sum asked, he was told to leave Spain under penalty of death.

The picture of three men arrested at Madrid several weeks ago were forwarded to Attorney-General Newton Estes by secret service agents at Washington, and Jones identified Jiminez as that of hotelkeeper at Valladolid, Spain, ringleader of the band. Jones will go to Madrid as a witness.

**PLANS MADE TO SINK MAINE WRECK IN SEA**  
Gen. W. H. Bixby Reports That Remains of Battleship Will Be Floated Away from Havana Next Month.

Washington.—General W. H. Bixby, chief of engineers of the army, brings from Havana the report that unless unforeseen difficulties are experienced all that is left of the old battleship Maine will be floated out of Havana Harbor on March 1 and sunk in the deep waters of the Gulf of Mexico, a few miles off the north coast of Cuba. General Bixby says about a third of the ship—all of that part forward of the rent which severed the bow section—has been dumped into the sea without attracting attention. The metal was cut up with an oxy-acetylene gas jet into half-ton fragments which were placed in scows and deposited about a mile off shore. It is expected that within a week or ten days only the after part of the ship, which it is proposed to float away intact, will remain in the cofferdam.

The after turret has been unbolted from the deck and is ready for transfer to the shore. It has been given to the city of Havana and is to be erected as a monument in the park.

One of the masts is now at Governors Island and the other is aboard the Collier Justin, awaiting transportation to the national cemetery at Arlington, where it will be placed over the graves of the victims of the Maine.

When the wreck is finally floated out to sea, with ceremony and in the presence of a distinguished company the cofferdam will be removed and nothing visible will be left in Havana Harbor to mark the scene of the great catastrophe. Deeply imbedded in the mud at the bottom of the harbor will lie the inverted forward turret of the ship with its 16-inch guns, which it was not thought worth while to raise.

**SUBMARINE FETE ON BOTTOM OF OCEAN**  
Society Women of California Planning Unique Affair; Guests to Wear Diving Suits

Los Angeles.—Society women of Los Angeles, San Francisco and Pasadena are planning a submarine fete to be held on the bottom of the ocean off Catalina Island early in March.

Walter Howlson Pritchard, the marine artist, is arranging the details and according to him the guests are to be attired in diving suits, each provided with oxygen tanks or air tubes. Catalina Island has been chosen for the unique affair because of the extraordinary clearness of the water and the remarkable marine gardens at the bottom of the sea.

**GIRL WILL BAKE BREAD FOR PRESIDENT TAFT**  
Lois Edmonds, Eleven-Year-Old Girl, Champion Breadmaker, Leaves for Washington

Chicago.—Miss Lois Edmonds, 11 years old, Iowa's champion breadmaker, left Chicago for Washington, where she will make a loaf of bread for President Taft. Despite her youth, Miss Edmonds wrested this honor from 400 other contestants.

With her are ten Iowa schoolboys, each a champion corn raiser in his own county. The children are being sent to Washington by the Iowa congressmen.
