
The after turret has been unbolted from the deck and is ready for transfer to the shore. It has been given to the city of Havana and is to be erected as a monument in the park.

One of the masts is now at Governors Island and the other is aboard the Collier Justin, awaiting transportation to the national cemetery at Arlington, where it will be placed over the graves of the victims of the Maine.

When the wreck is finally floated out to sea, with ceremony and in the presence of a distinguished company the cofferdam will be removed and nothing visible will be left in Havana Harbor to mark the scene of the great catastrophe. Deeply imbedded in the mud at the bottom of the harbor will lie the inverted forward turret of the ship with its 10-inch guns, which it was not thought worth while to raise.





