TONE FAVORABLE IN HOG MARKET

SHOW ADVANCE OF FROM FIVE TO TEN CENTS

Sheep Show Marked Strength Over Last Week—Cattle Market is Holding Good and Run Liberal—Wheat is Bearish.

There was a more favorable tone in the hog market at North Portland for the day. Tops sold at \$6.75, or an advance of 5c to 10c over last week's prices.

With best local hogs not bringing above \$6.75 and packers continuing to purchase swine at Missouri river points, the prices here are far out of line with what they should be.

There was a run of 586 hogs in the North Portland market today compared with 285 last Monday.

Nominal North Portland swine prices. Fancy mixed \$6.70 @ 6.75. Good heavy 6.65.

There was a strong tone in the sheep trade today. Although buyers continue to look at any offerings of lambs, they are nevertheless taking hold of muttons with much relish.

Movement of mutton for the day at North Portland was quite liberal. Receipts over Sunday were 1708 head compared with 719 last week.

The market was considered about 5c higher for selected offerings, ewes going at \$4.25 weighed off cars, which would mean \$4.15 on the fill.

Sheep market at North Portland: Select lambs \$5.50. Choice lambs \$5.25. Common lambs \$5.00.

Cattle Market is Holding. While there was considerable weakness in the cattle trade for the day owing to the liberal run and the heavy surplus held by killers, sales during the morning were made at practically the same prices as ruled at the close of last week.

North Portland cattle prices: Select steers \$5.95. Choice steers \$5.90.

CALL FOR BIDS.

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received at the office of the recorder of the City of Pendleton, Oregon, for a fire alarm system in accordance with specifications now on file with said recorder; said system embraces, amongst other things, the following:

One two circuit automatic storage battery controlling switchboard of very latest modern improvement made of the highest grade of material and workmanship.

Also one 1000 pound bell-metal fire bell installed in city hall tower, and one automatic striking machine capable of bringing out the full tone of such bell.

Also one fire alarm whistle, dimensions eight inch, to have two-inch supply pipe and one air tank large enough to supply the whistle; also one automatic air pump to keep air in the tank at working pressure.

One motor generator set for charging batteries.

Bidders are to bid per mile on line construction installed complete, including all labor and material including that for fire alarm boxes; successful bidder to take in part payment material already in use in Pendleton not needed by the city in the new system.

All of the above apparatus and material must comply with the requirements of the Board of Fire Underwriters of the Pacific Coast; but nothing called for in the specifications which cover a patented article shall bar or prevent any one from bidding who can furnish apparatus that will perform the same functions equally well.

All bids must be addressed to the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Pendleton, Oregon, and must be filed on or before 5 o'clock P. M. on February 14, 1912, with the recorder of said city at his office; bids will be opened by the Common Council of the city at its regular meeting to be held February 14, 1912, in the council room at the City Hall of the city at 7:30 o'clock p. m.

A certified check of five per cent of the bid will be required to accompany each bid, check to be made payable to the Mayor of the City of Pendleton and drawn on some bank of Pendleton, Oregon, as evidence of good faith.
