ARRIVALS ARE FULLY EQUAL TO THE DEMAND

Few Hogs Offered and Market Little Better Than Steady—Not Enough Sheep to Test Quotations—Wheat Shorts Secured.

(From Tuesday's Journal.) The market for cattle is down 10¢ for the day at North Portland with quite a fair run. Although the dressed meat trade remains in a very poor position and for that reason most killers have overpurchased their requirements, offerings at the present time are almost sufficient to take care of the trade during normal demand.

Best offerings in the cattle division at North Portland today sold around \$5.85, several lots taking the high point as compared with former deals at \$5.95 and even \$6 for similar quality.

There was a run of 202 cattle for the day at North Portland, compared with 396 head last Tuesday.

FIVE DOLLAR CIGAR LIKE ROMAN CANDLE

About Sixteen Inches Long, and Heidelberg Students Smoke Many of Them. St. Louis.—The demand for cigars selling at \$5 each is so great that it cannot be supplied, according to B. F. Alexander a cigar salesman of Havana, Cuba, who has just arrived in St. Louis.

"We could dispose of ten times as many \$5 cigars if we were able to turn them out," declared Alexander. "The difficulty is in the wrapper, which must be very large. You are likely to sort 100 bundles of tobacco and find only 100 wrappers suitable of this kind of cigar."

From a sample case containing 462 different sizes and prices of cigars, Alexander took one of the \$5 brand, known in the trade as "promontories," just as the 25-cent straight are called perfectos.

One feels like taking off his hat and bowing as the apex of nicotine luxury comes into view. It looks more like a yellow-colored Roman candle than a cigar. In size it is between fifteen and sixteen inches long, and 100 will contain 120 pounds of tobacco as compared with fourteen pounds to 1000 perfectos.

"These are bought mostly by people who enjoy the novelty of smoking such a cigar," said Alexander. "Banquets and smokers attended by wealthy men are the best buyers of the \$5 kind. The one place in the world which takes more than any other is Heidelberg, Germany."

"The students at the university there never seem to get enough of them. I have been told that besides buying them for smoking in the ordinary way, they will sometimes put one of these into a water pipe of the oriental type; then five or six students will get around the pipe and smoke it."

Size does not always value, according to Alexander. One insignificant little cigar which most people would take for a "stogie" really sells at \$1.50 while a larger and prettier one sells for a beggarly 50 cents each.

"These stories about the big financiers of the east and Europe smoking cigars a foot long are all bosh," declared the salesman. "While they pay as much as \$3 and \$4 apiece for their cigars, these are, generally speaking, of the ordinary shape and size. The cost is in the extra quality of the wrapper and filler, not in the size of the cigars. Such cigars generally are made to order."
