### Says Department Is Considering right application to the government to all our services. Plan for Immediate Change for Umatilla Project-Wrestlers Sign Agreement for Contest,

(Special Correspondence.)

Hermiston, Ore., Feb. 24 .- That the settlers on the Umatilla government project will receive a proposi-tion for the graduation of the water right payments is an assured fact. but just what the scale will be is not as yet known. It is thought that in the first unit the 1910 payment will be the only payment that will receive the graduated scale; that no credits will be given to any units on the amount of payments that have already been made in each unit. The Umatilla River Water Users' will hold a meeting on March 4, at which time the stockholders will be given a change of contract and also the bylaws which will enable settlers to obtain the payments on the graduated scale. They can have the graduation or they can keep to their old contract, there has been much speculation among the settlers in regard to the payment which is delinquent March 1, 1912, the following telegram has been received by G. 


