**KANSAS HEALTH PROVERBS.**  
With typical western progressiveness, the Kansas board of health has substituted for its February bulletin a "health almanac for 1912." If its readers will prove themselves as successful insurgents against the standard-bearers of diseases as they are insurgents against political standard-bearers, the death rate in the "Sunflower State" is due a decided tuck.

Some of the more striking epigrams of the almanac are:  
An open window is better than an open grave.  
Warm rooms have killed more people than ever froze to death.  
A light overcoat is better than a heavy cold.  
A mustard bath for the feet will do more to ward off pneumonia than a stiff drink from a gallon jug.  
Only the hidebound will be inclined to dispute these assertions. Those concerning open windows and warm rooms are especially applicable. We used to seal our houses hermetically on the approach of winter, for fear of taking cold. Now we learn that ventilation and pure, fresh air are as essential in December as in June, and that the closed windows and the super-heated rooms are friends to the great white plague and other germ diseases that prosper on lowered vitality.

Continuing the almanac says:  
A dirty well is more dangerous than a dirty kitchen. If your well and your roof both leak, fix the well first.  
Keep flies from the house and you will keep the doctor from the gate. Flies in the kitchen may be as dangerous as...

gerous as Rough on Rats in the pantry.  
We are inclined to believe that flies in the house and kitchen are infinitely more dangerous than Rough on Rats in the pantry, or any other poison in an exposed place. Poison is usually branded for what it is, and the majority of people can steer clear of it. Flies of the house variety are all potential killers of body and efficiency, in that they convey germs of typhoid, tuberculosis and other communicable diseases. The one way to baffle them is to rout them.  
Universal adoption of a plan approximating the Kansas idea would have a salutary influence in promoting health in this country. One application of health proverbs is not, however, sufficient. Teaching sanitation and hygiene is, like keeping on in this world, a matter of "keeping everlastingly at it." Observance of precautions against disease is, after all, a matter of habit. And it is relatively as easy to engrain a habit upon a community as upon an individual. Persistence and intelligence are the main factors in the formula, as has been abundantly established wherever a city, town or county started out to rid itself of a plague taking toll of life and efficiency.

**DRUDGE DESERVES DIVORCE.**  
Court Holds Missouri Farmer Cannot Work Wife Too Much.  
Kansas City, Mo.—If a man makes a mere drudge of his wife she is entitled to a divorce. That was the decision of Judge J. M. Johnson in the Kansas City court of appeals in the case of Henrietta A. Rapp against George Rapp, a wealthy farmer of Cooper county. When they were married twelve years ago he was a widower with eight children.  
Mr. Rapp was worth \$50,000 and had a nice home. He provided decently for his family. He didn't beat his wife or quarrel with her. But he placed on her shoulders an amount of work no woman could do with any

degree of health or happiness. Judge Johnson decided. She stood it as long as she could and then sued for divorce. Mr. Rapp contested it and the circuit judge in Cooper county dismissed her suit. She appealed.  
Judge Johnson sent the case back with directions to give her a divorce and alimony.

**STORK FOUND TO BE HARD WORKED**  
Four Trips Made Every Hour in California as Shown by State Records.  
Sacramento, Calif.—That the stork is the hardest working member of

the feathered tribe in California is shown by Statistician George D. Leslie, of the state health department, in figures indicating a trip four times every hour, or 96 a day, to as many homes in the state. In 1911 Dr. Stark made 34,828 professional calls, which were an increase of 2699 over 1910, and establishing the record for births for the state. The births in 1911 and increase over 1910 in the two principal cities were as follows: San Francisco, 8708—226 increase; Los Angeles, 5861—403 increase.
