### SLAIN TRAIN BANDIT NOTED "BAD MAN" 20 YEARS AGO

Identified as One of Gang Which Held Up Great Northern Train in 1901 and Got \$70,000 in Unsigned Bank Notes.

St. Louis, Mo.—Local police received positive confirmation that one of the bandits killed by Express Messenger David A. Trousdale near Sanderson, Texas, was Ben Kilpatrick, known here as the "Silent Train Robber" and the "Montana Train Robber."

Wilpatrick was convicted here for passing stolen bank notes, which it was claimed, were part of the loot obtained in the Great Northern train robbery near Wagner, Mont., in 1901. He was recently released from the federal prison at Atlanta and sent to Concho county, Texas, for trial on an old murder charge.

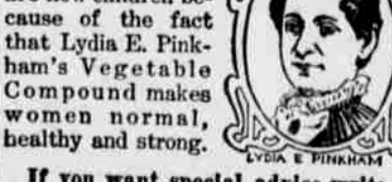
