LIST OF HUMPHREYS VICTIMS REACH 4

YOUNGER MAN CHARGES 2 MORE MURDERS TO BROTHER

Tells Officers His Step Father Was Slain By George Humphrey and Also George Damrose Was Strangled to Death.

Corvallis, Ore., March 21.—That George Humphrey, confessed murderer of Elizabeth Griffith, killed his stepfather, William King, near Dayton, Ore., and George Damrose of Hayhurst valley, near Yoncalla, Ore., is the additional charge made by Charles Humphrey, his brother, who was brought here today from Hillsboro. The first story of the Humphrey's connection with the crime was told to Sheriff Hancock of Washington county and A. H. Harris, a newspaper man, on the train between Hillsboro and Corvallis.

The story as given by Humphrey tallies closely with the facts of death in each case. Charles Humphrey was in good spirits when the newspapermen met him in charge of Sheriff Hancock, who was taking him to jail at Corvallis. He talked freely of the terror which had been in his mind for a long time, and was led step by step over the tale of the two tragedies, now practically forgotten.

The story of the strangling of William King was told for the first time. King and Humphrey's mother were married 32 years ago. For a long time they lived together, apparently without trouble. Then came separation and King moved to Dayton, Ore. There he lived alone. Hatred rankled in the breast of both Mrs. King and George Humphrey, and finally Humphrey went to Dayton in the afternoon, and the next morning King was found dead in bed.

Strangled, Not Heart Failure. It was a case of heart failure, people said. Charley Humphrey says his brother George strangled the man to death with his hands.

No suspicion was ever directed toward Humphrey. King had just sold a horse and buggy and it was supposed he had money about the house. Charley Humphrey says his brother realized about \$12 on the murder. Charley Humphrey attended the funeral, going to Dayton after his brother had returned from the killing. He said he wanted his mother to accompany him to the burial, but that she refused. The crime was the family resided near Dallas, King committed about six years ago, while was about 60 years of age, was rather corpulent and had enjoyed the best of health.

The Murder of Damrose. Damrose became a victim to George Humphrey's thirst for blood while the Humphrey family lived at Yoncalla, about four years ago, about the time George Selby was killed near Dallas.

Damrose lived in the foothills of Hayhurst valley, six miles from Yoncalla and two miles from the Humphrey place. He had been ailing and was thought to be ill enough for neighbors to sit up with him to give medicine. George Humphrey, so his brother Charley says, went to the Damrose house and stayed part or all of one night with the sick man. In the morning Damrose was dead and George Humphrey admitted to his brother that he strangled him with his thumbs. No money was reported as booty on this murder.

W.-O. DEVELOPMENT LEAGUE ORGANIZES

Walla Walla, Wash., March 21.—With headquarters at Walla Walla, the Southeastern Washington-Oregon Development League was organized yesterday by the delegates of five Washington counties and Umatilla county of Oregon.

Dr. E. W. White of Pasco was chosen president of the organization; and L. M. Brown of Walla Walla, secretary-treasurer; vice presidents were Franklin county, W. H. Miller of Connelly; in Walla Walla county, A. S. Dickinson of Waiilatburg, Umatilla county, J. P. Slover of Milton; Columbia county, Dr. C. H. Day of Dayton; Garfield county, J. R. Stevens of Pomeroy. Benton county is not in the organization as yet, but has been requested again to join, and will be allowed to name its own vice president.

Walla Walla will be headquarters, and the literature of the organization will be handled through this place. Every commercial organization affiliating will pay \$5 annual fees. There will be quarterly meetings, one of which will be the regular annual convention. Waiilatburg will have the next gathering in about three months, the date not having been definitely set.

It is planned by means of this club to advertise the country as a whole, and through the office of the secretary, to answer inquiries as well as to refer them to each Commercial club in the organization.
