HERMISTON HAS A GOOD WATER SUPPLY

Hermiston, Ore., April 9 .- The new city well has been completed and has an inexhaustible supply of water. It looks now as if the supply will exceed the demand for years to come. Last week a pump and engine were installed and a test was made. The water was measured and kept up a steady flow of 235 gallons per minute without lowering the water in the well enough to show.

With such a flow of water to start on it is certain that the supply is inexhaustible. All those who know state that the flow will increase. At this rate it would mean 24,000 gallons every hour or 576,000 in 24 hours. The reservoir has a capacity of
