Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the Common Council of The City of Pendleton held on March 27th, 1912, the following resolutions were adopted: Whereas, the Surveyor of The City of Pendleton, did on the 27th day of March, 1912, under direction and by requirement of the Common Council file plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Webb street, in The City of Pendleton from the east line of Cottonwood street to the south line of Court street, together with the estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, with a statement of the lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the percentage of the total cost of improvement which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement; and

Whereas, the Council has examined such plans and specifications and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work; and Whereas, the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is, in the judgment of the Common Council, properly to be included within such improvement district, and no property is excluded therefrom which should properly be included therein; and

Whereas, the improvement of the hereinabove described portion of said Webb street by macadamizing the same is at this time necessary; therefore, be it Resolved, by the Common Council of The City of Pendleton that it is expedient to improve and it is hereby proposed to improve Court street in The City of Pendleton from Byers' mill race eastward to the eastern limits of said City by macadamizing the same, such macadamizing to be twenty-four feet in width, being twelve feet on each side of the center line of said portion of Court street, and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor, prepared by Geary Kimbrell, City Surveyor, which were filed with the Recorder of said City on March 20th, 1912, which plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to; and be it further

Resolved, that the plans and specifications and estimates for such improvement, as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of The City of Pendleton on the 20th day of March, 1912, be and they are hereby approved and adopted; and be it further Resolved, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land so specially benefited by such improvement shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof; and be it further Resolved, that an assessment district is hereby created to be known as Assessment District No. 6, embracing the property to be assessed for the payment of such improvement, which assessment district shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

CATTLE SITUATION GOOD AT PORTLAND

MARKET ADVANCES 10 CENTS AND HOLDS GOOD Much Stock Received from Montana Points—Hog Price Highest in Country—Sheep Good—May Wheat Erratic. (From Monday's Journal.) The situation in the cattle trade at North Portland is extremely good and prices are holding very firm at \$7. This is a rise of 10c. Even during the morning there were sales as high as \$6.90@6.95, or the full of last week's market. Run of cattle for the day totaled 613 head compared with 678 last Monday and 965 on this same day a year ago. At that time there was an advance of a dime in the cattle trade with tops selling a nickel under the present market.

Sheep Market Is Good. There was a liberal increase in the offerings of sheep in the mutton division at North Portland today. Over Sunday arrivals totaled 970 head, compared with 762 head for the same period a week ago. The situation in the lamb trade continues congested with prices leading downward. Grain.
