

Grand Junction, Colo .- The school board has rescinded its action by which a half month's salary was withheld from each school teacher in order to force her to give due notice of


So many of the teachers married immediately after pay day that the school board used the plan of holding out a portion of the salary with the understanding that it should be forfeited in case due notice of inten-
