Denver-Secretary E. K. White-head of the Bureau of Animal and Child Protection estimates the loss o cattle in eastern Colorado at not les than 50,000 head and believes that a careful survey may run the total a high as 100,000 head.

"The stock find no nutri ment in last year's grass, which ha been leeched out by the months (snow and rain. The new grass, whe it comes, will kill rather than say the cattle, which are too weak to stan fresh feed.


