STOCK RECEIPTS LIGHT AT PORTLAND

FIVE CARLOADS TOTAL OF DAY'S OFFERINGS

Milton Hogs Bring Top Market Price—Cattle Trade Light With Bright Future Indicated—Sheep Steady—Wheat Bearish.

From Tuesday's Journal. There was little stock offering in the North Portland yards during the day, total offerings being one load of cattle, two loads of hogs and a similar number of sheep.

Top hogs again sold at \$5.40 in the local yards this morning. One of the loads came from Pomeroy and the other from Milton. Both brought the top price for quality.

Today's run of hogs totaled 180 head, compared with 473 last Tuesday and none on this day a year ago.

Cattle Market Is Strong. Only a single load of cattle came forward to the local yards this morning and it was not offered during the early day. It was shipped in by A. L. Whereas, the improvement of the herein above-described portion of said College street with bitulithic pavement on a bituminous base, is at this time necessary; therefore, be it

Resolved, by the Common Council of The City of Pendleton, that it is expedient to improve and it is hereby proposed to improve College street in The City of Pendleton, from the south line of Court street to the north line of Alta street, by paving the same with bitulithic pavement on a bituminous base, such pavement to be 34 feet wide, being 17 feet on each side of the center line of said College street, and to have curbs, gutters and other things as shown in the plans and specifications made by Geary Kimbrell, City Surveyor, filed with the City Recorder, on April 18, 1912, which plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to; and be it further

Resolved, that the plans and specifications and estimates for such improvement, as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of The City of Pendleton, on the 10th day of April, 1912, be and they are hereby approved and adopted; and be it further

Resolved, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land so specially benefited by such improvement, shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof; and be it further

Resolved, that an assessment district is hereby created, to be known as Assessment District No. 15, embracing the property to be assessed for the payment of such improvement, which assessment district shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows: to-wit:

Commencing at the northwest corner of Lot 1, Block 11, original Town of Pendleton, Oregon, thence along the south line of Court street easterly 260 feet, thence south 23 degrees, 36 minutes, east 310 feet, to the north line of Alta street, thence westerly to the southwest corner of the Court House Block, thence westerly to the southeast corner of Lot 7, Block 11, original Town of Pendleton, Oregon, thence westerly to the southwest corner of the said Lot 7, thence northerly to place of beginning; and be it further

Resolved, that a copy of this resolution, together with the notice that the Surveyor's estimate of the proportion of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land within the assessment district in said resolutions described is on file in the office of the City Recorder.
