Filled Cookies.

Take one cup of sugar, one-half up each of butter and milk, one egg. three and one-half cups of flour, two teaspoons of cream of tartar, one teaspoon each of soda and vanilla, and a little more flour if needed to roll thin. Put the cookles in the pan, place a teaspoon of the filling on each, not letting it come quite to the edge, then put another cookle on top. Bake in a quick oven, taking care not to scorch the cakes. They require longer baking than for single
