CALVES REACH A NEW MARK, PORTLAND

TWELVE HEAD BRING PRICE OF \$8.85 PER 100

Cattle Situation is Again Showing Much Strength-Hog Market Maintains Strong Condition - Sheep Market is Showing Much Easier-Wheat Higher,

(From Friday's Journal).

Kopplin today received the highest price ever reached in' the Portland market for calves. He had 12 head from Pineview that averaged 142 pounds that sold at \$8.85.

The cattle situation is again show ing much strength here. The highest price ever paid for calves was obtained this morning when 13 head that averaged 142 pounds went at \$8.85. This is a dime above anything heretofore received in the North Portland yards.

Outside of the calves, there was practically nothing offering in the mattle market here today. Only a single head appeared to save the market from showing a goose egg.

According to leading receivers, the entire cattle market is permeated with strength, and with the recent sale of steers at \$7.15, the market is considered better than at this time during any previous year.

This fully confirms the early forecasts made by this paper that cattle prices in 1912 would break all previous high records for the Portland market. At that time meat companies were bearish in their views. In fact the extent of their views can be seen when it is noted that few of them contracted any material supply in ad vance, and have therefore been for ed upon the open market for the daily needs.

Even as short a time ago as a fe weeks leading meat companies d not seem to appreciate the fact the cattle were scarce, although they ha ample warning in The Journal f months that the northwest's supp was dwindling. 




