### HARMON, BEAR FIELDER LEADS LEAGUE BATTING

Boise, as Team, Leads With Pendleton a Close Second; Fielding Averages Good.

Cotton Harmon, the hard hitting outfielder of the Walla Walla team, is the leading batter of the Western Tri-State league, having a total average of .438. Chet Luttrell, who played third base with the Boise team during the fore part of the season and is now doing the same position with La Grande, is the only other batter playing in an average number of games who is clouting the ball over the 400 mark. Aside from Harmon, the Bears have only one other man, Captain Brown, who is hitting over .300.

Nadeau is leading the Pendleton team with an average of .328 and there are four other Buckaroos who are sticking over the .300 mark. Rader, Wilson, Pembroke and Teck, while Augustus is just two points below the mark. Pitcher Smith of Boise, has an average of .750 but he only appeared in one game. Gimlin has five others hitting over .300 and he has the best team average, .284. Pendleton being second with .271.

None of the team averages as given below are absolutely correct inasmuch as a number of the players have been with two teams. Thus Teck, who appears on the Pendleton lineup, did most of his batting while with La Grande. Scott, now with Boise, made his average of .375 while playing with La Grande. Luttrell, Harmon, Naughton, King and McRae all played with the Boise aggregation more or less.
