ly, the Clark followers were loyal to their favorite to the end.

**Underwood and Clark Withdraw.**  
Baltimore, Md., July 2.—At 2:15 o'clock this afternoon, Underwood withdrew as a candidate for the democratic nomination for president.

Shortly afterwards, Champ Clark released his delegates from their instructions.

Senator Stone asked and obtained unanimous consent to make a statement. He said that Missouri would "stand pat" on Clark until the finish, but if defeated, Clark will loyally support the convention's choice.

Governor Foss of Massachusetts, withdrew in favor of Wilson. Fitzgerald conceded Wilson's nomination. Fitzgerald then moved that Wilson be nominated by acclamation. Senator Reed of Missouri blocked this move, however, and said he wanted to be registered as voting for Clark to the last.

**Illinois Breaks Away.**

Illinois broke on the 43rd ballot, 58 going to Wilson.

On the 43rd ballot, Virginia broke, casting a solid vote of 24 for Wilson, giving him a majority for the first time in Virginia.

West Virginia broke at 12:45, giving Wilson 16 votes. On roll call, Maryland voted as follows: Clark 9, Wilson 5-7, absent 1-2.

On the 44th ballot, Colorado broke nine votes to Wilson. Indiana voted solid for Wilson. Pennsylvania voted solid for Wilson, also Wisconsin and Utah.

Elwood, Ind.—One woman teacher in the high school and eight in the grades announced to Superintendent J. L. Clauser before leaving the city for the summer vacation that they are to be married during the next few months. Mr. Clauser says Cupid has hit the schools a heavier blow this year than ever before, and to qualify for teaching positions in the future applicants who have passed the thirty mark and are still single will be given the preference.

## BALL PLAYER PROTECTS WIFE

Leaves Game for Battle When Fans Make Insulting Remarks.

Terre Haute, Ind.—Responding to a call from his wife, Catcher Ed Waring of Terre Haute jumped into the grand stand and beat up Sidney Murr and Jess Sims, who had been seated back of Mrs. Waring. Murr was severely punished.

Murr and Sims were arrested, but later released when Mrs. Waring filed no further complaint. Waring had just removed his mask and started to the bench in the sixth inning of the game with Wheeling, when Mrs. Waring ran to the railing and called her husband, saying that the men had made insulting remarks to her.

Waring leaped into the boxes and had knocked Murr into the aisle. Sims escaped injury. Waring continued playing.

## GIRL DEAD, ARREST WOMAN.

15-Year-Old Miss Pursued and Slain While Eloping.

Louisville.—Fifteen-year-old Olsa Plumlee, pursued from the home in which she had been a guest by Mrs. Fred Parker, who was at once the girl's hostess, cousin and wife of the man with whom it is said the girl was eloping, was overtaken, shot and instantly killed near Hestand, Ky., according to mail advices received here from that remote section of the state.

Details are lacking, though it is said both Parker and his wife are under arrest at Celina, Tenn. Dry Ridge, Tenn., home of the Plumlee girl, and the other two places named are near the line between the two states.

## 32 COUPLES IN A BRIDAL "SLEEPER"

Lackawanna Compelled to Put On Extra Car for Scranton Newlyweds.

Scranton, Pa.—Thirty-two bridal couples left here in the same sleeping car over the Lackawanna Railroad for New York. They arrived at the local station at about the same time. The train the couples had wished to take was crowded, so the railroad people decided to attach an extra sleeper. This was done and the thirty-two brides and thirty-two bridegrooms got aboard.

The Railroad Publicity Bureau saw a chance for some real live advertising and offered to conduct the entire party over New York, the party to be known as the "Lackawanna bridal troupe."
