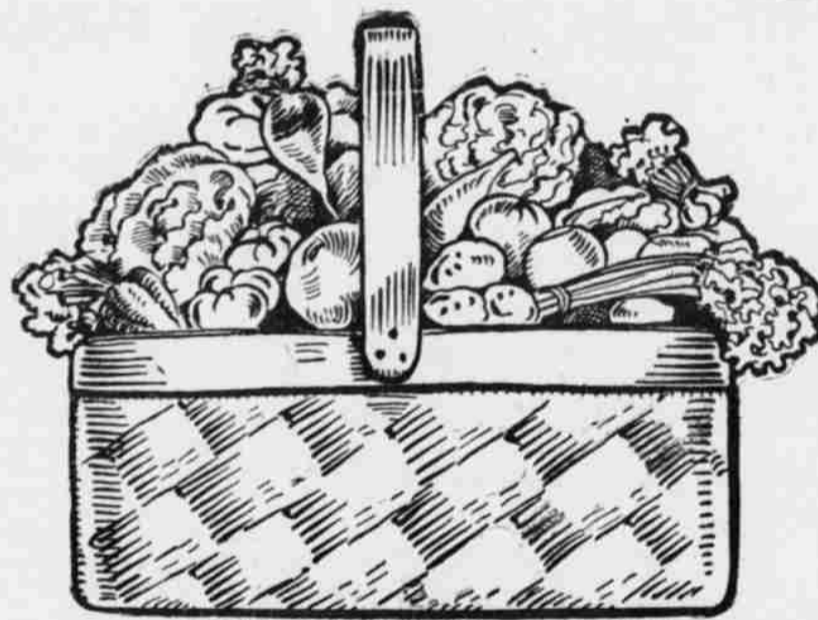

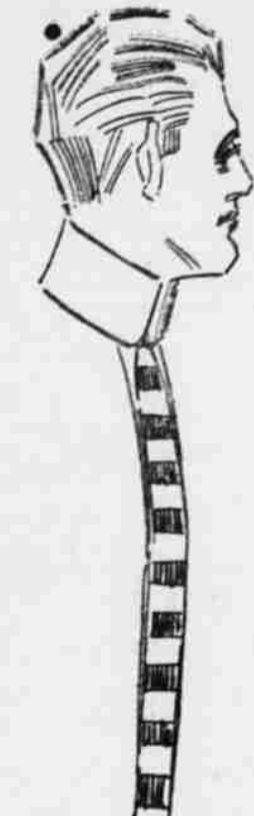

Brown, B. Thornton, William Homan, Viola, alias Harry A. York, E. E. Wedemeyer, Earl Taylor, W. D. Tierney, Ben Trout and Clarence Thomas.

Through a mistake on the part of the officials investigating the case, James Mitchell, a negro, was arrested in connection with the scandal, and when the mistake was discovered he was at once released.

ACTS OF REPRESSION IN CROATIA SPREAD REPUBLICAN IDEAS

Vienna, Austria.—The policy of the

Austrian government in Croatia, which has been during the last five months one of repression and absolutism, has had for effect the spread of republican ideas.

M. de Cuvaj is waging a campaign against the secondary schools in the same way as Count Khuen Hedervary when ban of Croatia from 1883 to 1903 checked the growth of primary education. M. de Cuvaj has caused educational fees to be raised, disciplinary regulations made more stringent, sporting and reading clubs to be forbidden, and the private reading of students supervised by professors.

The Arbitr Zeitung commenting on the policy states that the object of the royal commissioner is to check the spread of higher education, and that the result will be the same as when Count Khuen Hedervary undertook the compression of Croatia in the interests of Hungary, namely the enormous increase in the percentage of illiterates.

SPLENDID ROYAL JEWELS ARE SOLD AT HYDERABAD

Hyderabad, India.—Probably the largest quantity of ancient and val-

uable jewels that has ever come into the market at one time in Sind has been disposed of lately at Hyderabad. A number of buyers came from Calcutta, Delhi and Surat, attracted by the announcement that the jewels of his highness Sir Nurmanhomed Kahn the head of the Talpurs or royal family of Sind, were to be sold.

Very high prices were realized. Old Sindhi ornaments and beautiful old diamonds, emeralds and rubies which had belonged to his highness' ancestors went for enormous sums. It was a noticeable fact that the jewelers from Delhi secured most of the emer-

alds, whilst the pearls fell to the Gujerat men.

BOTTLE DRYERS.
