NEW INDIAN CAPITAL IS BEING ERRECTED BY LABORERS

Delhi, India.—The new buildings in Delhi which are to serve as the temporary headquarters of the government are being rapidly run up. It is now possible to get an idea as to the future appearance of the place.

Sixteen thousand laborers, under Colonel Cole are hard at work, and it is more than probable that the building will be complete within a year. No efforts are to be spared to make the quarters provided for officials as comfortable as possible, although perfectly wise economy is being observed. Metcalf house on the banks of the Jumna, which is to provide housing for additional members of the council, is being considerably enlarged. The members of the council and other officials are to be accommodated in Curzon house, when its enlargement is completed.

The council chamber, a paneled room around which runs a gallery, is to be found in a big semi-circular building stretching along the Allpur road, with long wings extending on either side. The government press, post and telegraph offices will be adjacent to the council chamber in a four block building of immense proportions which occupies a piece of ground immediately behind the edifice in Allpur road.

Circuit house on the famous ridge above the Durbar camp will be the future residence of the Viceroy of India. A small city is springing up away to the north of Circuit house designed for the use of English and Indian clerks, government officials, pressmen and members of the Viceroy's Regal band.
