BANK CONDITIONS IN OREGON EXCELLENT

Salem, Ore., Jan. 13.—"Banking conditions are generally very satisfactory and the adoption of principles of sound and conservative banking is more noticeable," states Will Wright, superintendent of banks, in his fifth annual report.

"Assets are in a more satisfactory condition, through the elimination of bad and doubtful items. Investments in stocks show a large decrease,

while investments in high class bonds and real estate mortgages have been materially increased.

"Since the last report of this department there has been an increase of only two bands, yet a net gain of \$406,299.80 is shown in banking capital, through increases of capital, surplus and profits.

"Deposits at the date of the last report of condition, November 28, 1912, exclusive of postal savings deposits, amounted to \$59,471,629.46. The total cash on hand and balances due from banks was \$19,301,929.87, or 32 2/5 per cent—which is largely in excess of reserve requirements.

Compared with the report of conditions at the close of business December 5, 1911, the total deposits show an increase of \$1,452,081.29."

Regarding legislation, Commissioner Wright says to make operative the amendment to the constitution adopted at the last election fixing the liability of stockholders of state banks at 100 per cent in excess of the par value of their stock holdings, further legislation will be necessary.

"There is a demand for legislation for the regulation and supervision of trust companies," he says. "Under existing laws, only such trust companies as transact banking business

are under the supervision of this department. The operation of some so-called trust companies is a menace, not only to the public, but to legitimate trust companies as well.

"DICK" LE GALLIENNE TO LIVE LIKE THE HOBOES

Author and Third Wife Sail for Marselles and Will Hike to Paris. New York.—Richard Le Gallienne, who wrote "The Poet With the Coward's Tongue," in reply to William Watson's "The Woman With the Serpent's Tongue," sailed for Marselles on the steamer Canada to spend the

next four months "as a hobo."

"I have given up city life for good," he said, "as I can find in nature all the dramatic contrasts of city life. The same conflict, the same tyranny, the same injustice. In flowers I find the same goodness and beauty as I do among human beings; I also find the same ugliness.

"The Gypsies and 'hoboes' have the right idea. Unconventionally they roam at will. If men like the Goulds, Vanderbilts, Morgans and other millionaires were to follow their example they would soon obtain the rest of soul that they can not get by the expenditure of their millions."

TAFT LEASES NEW HAVEN HOME

Will Occupy Parmelee Mansion Soon After Leaving White House. New Haven, Conn.—It was announced that President Taft has leased the Parmelee mansion here for a term of two years, with the privilege of purchasing. The president is expected to take up his residence here soon after leaving the white house.
